COMMUNITY MITIGATION

GOAL

Minimize the morbidity and the social and economic impacts of COVID-19 by slowing the transmission of disease to protect

• Individuals at increased risk for severe illness



The healthcare and critical infrastructure workforces





GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- Consider all aspects of a community that might be impacted including those most vulnerable to severe illness and those that may be more impacted socially or economically.
- 2 | Care should be taken to minimize disruptions to daily life to the extent possible.
- 3 | Scale mitigation activities up or down depending on the evolving local situation.

GREEN AREAS BELOW = CURRENT STATUS OF STANISLAUS COUNTY

DETERMINIG A LEVEL OF COMMUNITY TRANSMISSION

Level 1 -None to minimal

- a. Isolated cases
- b. Limited community transmission
- c. No evidence of exposure in large communal settings such as healthcare, school, mass gathering

Level 2 - Moderate

- a. Widespread and/or sustained transmission (3 generations of spread or more)
- b. Confirmed exposure
 within communal settings
 with potential for rapid
 increase in suspected cases

Level 3 - Substantial

- a. Large scale community transmission
- b. Increased hospitalizations
- c. Healthcare staffing impacted
- d. Multiple cases within communal settings (e.g., healthcare, school, mass gathering)

Note: Additional factor to take into consideration includes transmission in adjacent counties.

RESPONDING TO THE LEVEL OF COMMUNITY TRANSMISSION

Level 1 -None to minimal

- a. Personal protective actions (e.g., 6 feet social distance and hand washing)
- b. Planning and preparedness

Level 2 - Moderate

- a. Discontinue non-essential travel and large gatherings
- b. People at increased risk should avoid contact with others (e.g., 65+ elderly, underlying medical conditions)
- c. Stay at home if possible

Level 3 - Substantial

- a. Shelter in place
 - Recommendation or order depending on severity
